Princess Maha Chakri Award

**The Award given to teachers
who change students' lives**



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In 2015, on the occasion of Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn's 60th Birthday Anniversary, the Princess Maha Chakri Award (PMCA) was established in recognition of HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn's contribution to teachers and dedication to education. HRH began working in education when HRH accompanied the late King Bhumibol Adulyadej, King Rama IX and Queen Sirikit to remote areas in Thailand. HRH was tasked to interview people and find out about their education and needs. As a result, HRH has accumulated experiences in educational development for over forty years.

Besides being an educational development advocate, HRH is also a great teacher. HRH has been teaching at Chulachomklao Royal Military Academy and at several universities in Thailand since 1980. HRH is aware that teachers play a crucial role in students' achievement. Thus, HRH initiates several projects for teachers such as scholarships for pre-service teachers and capacity building programmes for in-service teachers. HRH understands how important it is to help teachers, so that they can do their job efficiently to help students become qualified human resources for the country.

In honour of HRH's devotion to teachers, the Princess Maha Chakri Award is given to outstanding teachers from eleven Southeast Asian Countries (ASEAN and Timor-Leste) every two years. The general criteria and mantra of the Award is that she or he is a teacher who changes students' lives, particularly the disadvantaged groups. Ministry of Education of each country will select their best teachers and submit their nominations to the PMCA Foundation for HRH's endorsement.

The PMCA Award is the beginning of a new journey for the PMCA Recipients. After receiving the Award, the PMCA Foundation works closely with the PMCA Recipients on enhancement programmes which range from scaling up the activities of the PMCA Recipients to other teachers and students, building capacity for the PMCA Recipients, to providing financial support for new initiatives of the PMCA Recipients.

The PMCA Forum is one of the enhancement programmes which the PMCA Foundation set up to be a platform for the PMCA Recipients to share their knowledge and experiences with other teachers and concurrently learn new knowledge. The 1st PMCA Forum was organised in 2017, the 2nd PMCA Forum was conducted in 2019, and this year the 3rd PMCA Forum will showcase the 2019 Princess Maha Chakri Award Recipients' best practices. The PMCA Forum aims to serve as a community of practice for professional development for all teachers in Southeast Asia and beyond.



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The Princess Maha Chakri Award

The Princess Maha Chakri Award is an Award given every two years to teachers from eleven countries in Southeast Asia (ASEAN and Timor-Leste), who change students' lives and have made significant impact to education.

The Princess Maha Chakri Award comprises:

1. A Princess Maha Chakri Award Medal
2. A gold honorary brooch
3. A Princess Maha Chakri Award Plaque
4. A prize money of USD 10,000
5. A certificate of honour

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The Nomination Process

The Princess Maha Chakri Award Foundation provides the general criteria to the Ministry of Education of the eleven countries and each respective Ministry of Education will set up their own detailed criteria for selection. After extensive selection process, each Ministry of Education will submit their nomination to the Princess Maha Chakri Award Foundation. The Foundation will then present the nominations to Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn for endorsement during an Annual Meeting. Once the nominations are endorsed, the Princess Maha Chakri Award Committee Members will visit the eleven nominees at their schools to learn more about their work. During the visit, the Princess Maha Chakri Award Committee Members will pay a courtesy visit to the Ministry of Education and the Royal Thai Embassy in each country and work together to provide support to the PMCA Recipients.

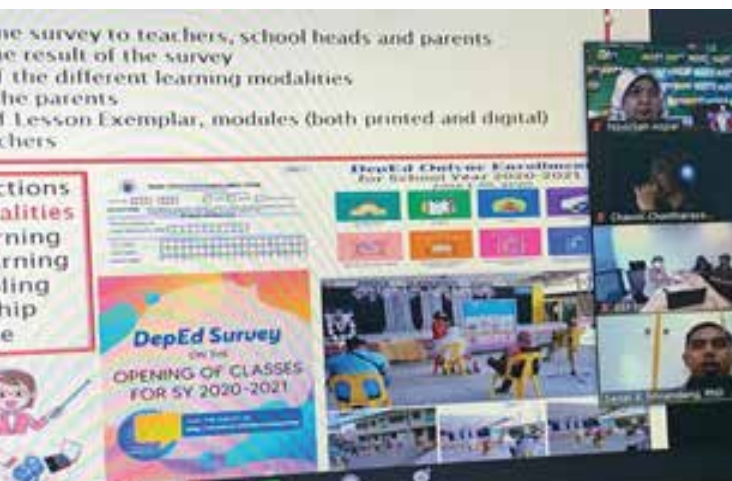
1. Activities

Activities after receiving The Princess Maha Chakri Award 2019

After receiving the PMCA, Ms. Xiuwen has contributed more in the development of resources and programmes to support learning for students with Special Educational Needs (SEN). She has also worked with her colleagues in their professional development. During the COVID-19 pandemic, she worked with them in the areas of SEN and Info-communication Technology (ICT) to develop Home-based Learning (HBL) packages. These just-in-time learning packages equipped teachers with e-pedagogy and knowledge of various ICT tools and platforms to enhance student learning. Furthermore, she has also initiated The Purple Parade Awareness Carnival with the purpose of building an inclusive school culture.

1. Providing educational and social emotional support for lower progressing and SEN students

Having witnessed how SEN students can blossom under the constant care and guidance of teachers, parents and community partners who understand their needs, Ms. Xiuwen finds teaching and supporting students with SEN to be a deeply meaningful and inspiring experience. Recognising the importance of literacy, she worked with her Allied Educators to conceptualise and develop a recess reading programme, the Reading Warriors Programme (RWP). This programme provides timely intervention, with a tiered system of literacy support for lower primary students who face difficulties with reading. Since its implementation in 2009, it has gained the support of many parent volunteers who have come on board to be trained as reading coaches. They play a key role in assisting teachers by providing daily one-to-one coaching for lower primary students who need more help in developing literacy skills. The RWP has benefitted many lower primary students, who not only saw a significant improvement in their literacy scores, but also developed an interest in reading.



2. Building an inclusive school culture

Ms. Xiuwen strongly believes that all of us learn and interact in different ways, some of us may need more time to learn, and we should always empathise with and help one another. Thus, the social support provided by the rest of the student population is very important. As a result, she initiated the event, The Purple Parade Awareness Carnival, with the theme “Embracing Differences”, to promote greater awareness and understanding of individuals with SEN. In this annual event, teachers turn up in a vibrant sea of purple to show their solidarity in supporting the special needs community. She collaborated with her Allied Educators and her colleagues who are trained in SEN to conceptualise and implement a series of engaging activities for all students to have a better understanding of individuals with special needs. These activities include an assembly talk to educate students about the importance of empathy and compassion in building an inclusive community, as well as game booths, which allow students to apply their knowledge of the different types of special needs and the ways to interact with people with special needs.

Through this annual event, students are more aware of the role that each of them can play to embrace inclusivity, and they also acquire a deeper understanding of how individuals with special needs can be better integrated into the school and society.



Future Plans

With the experience from her PMCA learning trip to the Central Special Education Centre in Bangkok, Ms. Xiuwen plans to utilise the PMCA monetary award to revamp the multi-sensory room in her school, Anglo-Chinese School (Primary). She is working with her Allied Educators to design a more conducive room to develop the senses of students with SEN through the use of special lighting, music, and objects as a form of therapy to help them self-regulate their behaviours.

A school-based SEN workshop is also in the pipeline to equip teachers with knowledge to perform Functional Behaviour Analysis (FBA) to understand the underlying reasons for student behaviour and devise a behaviour intervention plan to change inappropriate or undesirable behaviour. Designing an effective plan requires team effort, and she will collaborate with her teachers to gather information from various sources, such as from school records and through interviews with teachers who teach SEN students. They will then propose intervention strategies to correct the disruptive behaviours that interfere with student learning. With this workshop on FBA, teachers can use a more targeted and structured approach to manage the behaviour of students with SEN.

With the inspiration from Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri's continued work in providing equity in education for all, as an educator, Ms. Xiuwen will continually Coach, Affirm, Relate and Enthuse (CARE) students, regardless of their background and learning needs.

Activities after receiving The Princess Maha Chakri Award 2019

After receiving the 3rd PMCA in 2019, Mr. Suthep donated some of his monetary award to Baan Khlong Nam Sai School for learning materials, scholarships and for further development of the school. He organises activities that inspire other teachers, students, and the communities.

His teaching responsibility includes Occupation and Technology for Grade 5–9 students and Skills Development for Careers based on students' interests. He initiated a project, "The Development of Learning Resource and Models for Professional Skills and Employability" (โครงการการพัฒนาแหล่งเรียนรู้และสร้างแกนนำเพื่อการพัฒนาทักษะอาชีพสู่การมีงานทำ) which comprises 3 main areas:

1. Carpentry

According to studies and area exploration of the Baan Khlong Nam Sai community, the area is mostly forest and contains many bamboos, which can be utilised. In order to conserve local wisdom from Southern Thailand and create jobs, Mr. Suthep trains the students of Baan Khlong Nam Sai School carpentry skills, using the local wood and bamboo to build tables, chairs and bird cages. Later on, the bird cages have become very popular and in need in the community which helps students earn some income.

2. Sewing

The Muslim community around Baan Khlong Nam Sai School has a number of sewing professionals, and most female students wear Hijab as part of their student uniform. Mr. Suthep helps the school organise an activity, where students make hijabs and scout neckerchiefs which are in line with the students' needs. It also reduces parents' spending and creates income for the students.

3. Welding

Welding is an important and necessary technique, especially for Baan Khlong Nam Sai community where rubber tree, fruit, and betel nut plantations are among the most common types of agriculture. Therefore, Mr. Suthep organises an activity where students learn welding skills and use them to make betel nut separators, which increase efficiency and productivity of betel nut handling before selling them to the market.

Moreover, students have also built hand sanitiser dispenser in order to help the community tackle the COVID-19 pandemic.



Other additional skills

4. Hairdressing

Baan Khlong Nam Sai School has haircut rules. Since many students keep long hair or fail to observe the school's haircut rules, together with the fact that the community does not have sufficient number of hairdressing salons, Mr. Suthep helps the school establish a professional development centre for hairdressing. Students master haircutting skills, which helps them raise income.

5. Cooking

Culinary skills form a part of essential skills for living. Since Baan Khlong Nam Sai Community has a reasonable amount of banana and pineapple supply, suitable to be utilised as ingredients to make sweets and desserts, Mr. Suthep creates a culinary programme for both savouries and sweets, with the hope of raising income for the community and creating jobs for students.

6. Electricity

Electricians who specialise in electrical wiring inside a building are necessary for Baan Khlong Nam Sai Community. The school had carried out a study on local natural resources and found that bamboos are resources that are essential and abundant; hence, Mr. Suthep organises activities where students learn electricity skills and apply them to build bamboo lanterns and integrate them to the school electric system.



7. Handicraft: Serama Chicken

In order to tackle plastic waste problems, especially drinking water bottles, and reduce pollution from incineration as a plastic waste treatment, Mr. Suthep encourages the reuse of plastics by setting up a handicraft course together with his colleagues to teach students to make Serama chicken handicraft, using used plastic bottles.

Future Plans

1. Scale up the “The Development of Learning Resources and Models for Professional Skills and Employability” Project (โครงการการพัฒนาแหล่งเรียนรู้และสร้างแกนนำเพื่อการพัฒนาทักษะอาชีพสู่การมีงานทำ) and extend it to other schools.
2. Increase the number of career choices in the Learning Resources Project, so that students have more skills and opportunities.
